NATIONAL MOTORCYCLE RALLY 2023

Eleven riders and partners attended both the Southland annual rally and the 28th National Motorcycle Rally in Invercargill. Zig, Colin and Nev were the most adventurous riding down while the rest of us trailered our bikes down, Zig on Charlie the 1956 Harley, Colin on the trusty 1977 Honda and Nev on his 1988 GB400.

Saturday was the Southland branch annual rally and it was exceedingly hot not ideal conditions for riding gear, the local car owners probably wondered if their rally had been hijacked with the greater portion of entrants being motorcycles. 8 of us attended this, Steve on the 1936 Matchless and Mindy on her 1947 BSA 250 were first of the locals away followed by myself and Paula two-up on the 62 Triumph. Simple instructions and good riding roads had everyone to the lunch stop for field events and a welcome break in the shade with temperatures in the 30's, no one lingered for too long. If we had known what was in store, we may have soaked up a bit more sun.

At the presentation that evening Steve showed his prowess taking out the post vintage section as overall winner and first post vintage field test.

The National rally started on Sunday with the public display and field events and the weather was less than great, alternating between drizzle, rain and periods of fine making for interesting spectating of field events on wet grass and it was fairly evitable that an oops would happen, over exuberance in the slalom resulted in a horizontal bike and rider who received a rousing cheer and applause, by 2 o'clock with threatening weather the decision was made to call it a day, those that left then probably only got damp heading back to their motels, those of us who hung about for a further 10 mins rode back in a deluge of biblical proportions.

Monday was rally day and the kitchen staff at the Southland clubrooms put on a fantastic spread before everyone set off. All three routes short 80km medium 130km and long 210km were all to end up at Riverton for lunch we all made it but with varying degrees of success. Giles on the 47 Royal Enfield, Wendy on her BSA M20 and John on his 51 Triumph got through their first national with no hassles at all reaching Riverton in good time, Zig, Colin and Nev on the long route also had no problems, alas some of us were less fortunate. I was enjoying the pleasures of 1920s motorcycling, slipping clutch, get it hot, slip it for a bit, burn gearbox oil off

it problem solved, gale force head wind blowing from somewhere south of Stewart Island caused an overheating stop, wish I had picked the short route, rider and bike cool down in the rain off again, 20 mins from lunch, stops dead, no compression, nothing, remove valve caps, cylinder plug, lift valves, poke blow stick, fingers in and under anything that goes up and down, give up and ring for the van. Contemplate hole in piston, kick it again as nothing else to do and it fires into life and settles into a happy idle, not even remotely amused, race off passing a surprised Paula in van going the other way overtake 4 that's 4 other motorcyclist (going good now) and make lunch pull up and the carb proceeds to overflow dumping what little petrol I have left on the footy field. Limp back to Invercargill.

If I thought my day was slightly trying Steve was having fun also, after fuelling up and a comfort stop he fired the Matchy up, literally, a backfire through the carb resulted in a fire ball similar to that which wiped out the dinosaurs, with wiring and fuel lines quickly consumed and a full tank of gas sitting above, things were looking a little dodgy, fortunately Steve managed to get the fuel off and throw enough riding gear in over and around the bike to smother it. In ever optimistic style Steve said the wiring really needed redoing anyway they are only simple fuel lines and the paints got a nice patina to it now. And Mindy did what she always does chewed up the miles faultlessly on the little BSA C10.

The evenings prize giving was held at the Ascot and as a branch we did well, John with his 1951 Triumph Tiger 100 gained a well-deserved third place in the concours, Giles on his first rally placed 2nd in the post war time trial and Steve 3rd in the post vintage time trial before his pyro technic display which would have also won him the hard luck prize if he hadn't engaged in some dubious conversations with the judges steering them towards some other unfortunate soul somehow I ended up with first vintage time trial and the Canterbury cup for best performance by a vintage (little did they know!)

If awards are being given out two more should be presented, Mindy who did both the Southland and National Rally on the little side valve c10 one of the smaller bikes on the rallies and had to watch Steve try to turn himself into a kebab never stopped smiling, and Colin not our youngest member who plonked his arse on the Honda rode through rain, wind and temperatures in the thirties for 2373 kilometres without a hitch well done.
